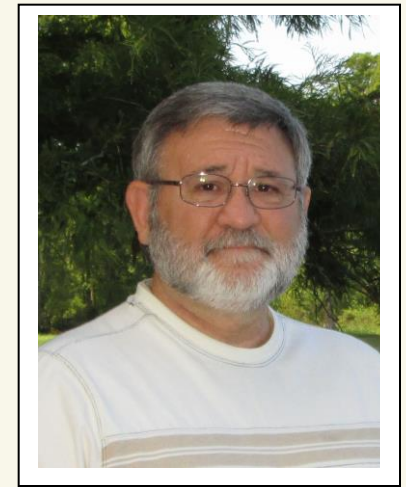

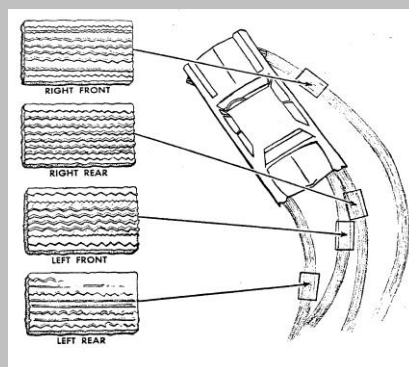
COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This training class has been approved by the International Association for Identification as credit towards certification or recertifications

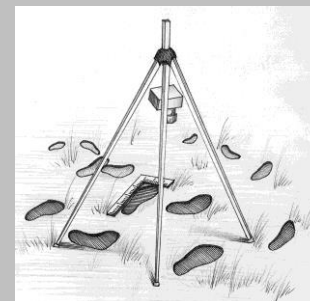
